GENERAL DESCRIPTION (see job description for complete list of job functions)

The North Shore Water Commission is accepting applications for the position of OPERATOR TECHNICIAN. This full-time position is responsible for assisting in the operation of the water treatment plant and related equipment. This position is responsible for operating equipment such as valves and pumps, adjusting process equipment such as chemical feed pumps, and performing laboratory tests including microbiological and chemical analyses. Work also includes maintaining, calibrating, and performing minor repair of instrumentation. The incumbent works under general supervision of the Working Foreman and Plant Manager. PLEASE NOTE: This position works a rotating shift that consists mainly of nights and weekends.

- All applicants must complete testing administered by the North Shore Water Commission to be considered for employment; test scores will be used in the hiring process.
- Experience with information technology or SCADA-controlled systems is preferred but not required.
- Background check will be conducted before hiring.
- Applicants that have T-1 or S-1 surface water certification by the State of Wisconsin or are scheduled to take the May, 2012 test may be given preference over those who haven't.
